
Topic Overview-Red

Experience:

Start Point:

What is London like today? Children will create a guide book to London in 2023.



End Point:







Science- Children will be developing knowledge of materials

Year 2: Name a range of common materials, identify their properties and link this to their every day uses

Year 1: Name a range of common materials and develop an understanding of their properties Year 2: Why are some materials better suited for certain jobs? E.g. why is a house made of bricks instead of glass?

Year 1: Sorting materials into categories

Using knowledge of <u>materials</u> to support scientific enquiry:

Year 2: Which material would be strongest for building London Bridge? Children will decide on a range of materials to test, recording results and reaching a conclusion.

Year 1:

Geography: Children will be developing their knowledge of London


What is a London? What is it like there? How is it similar/ different to Galleywood? Children will use atlases, maps, Google Earth and information texts to research London and its landmarks.

Children will build knowledge about different human and physical features of London including the River Thames, Buckingham Palace and St Paul's Cathedral. Children to create a guidebook (Year 2)/ poster (Year 1) about London and its features.

Art: Children will be developing skills in collage:

Children will look at some examples of collages and discuss what makes them effective. They will use a range of coloured materials to create a fiery sky based on an image from The Great Fire of London text. Children will create a collage based on a scene from The Great Fire of London. The scene will include contrasting colours for the flames, smoke and buildings.





Year 2 Computing: Children will be developing knowledge and skills in computing systems and networks

Children will identify how IT can support us in our every day lives



Children will use websites to research about The Great Fire of London.

Children will present their research in a poster format. They will discuss how IT sources can be beneficial when conducting research, as well as the care they must take when researching online.

Year 1 Computing: Children will be developing knowledge and skills in creating media

Children will explore the different tools available to them to create digital art



Children will choose appropriate tools to create a digital collage of a scene from The Great Fire of London

History : Children will be developing knowledge and skills in investigating the past

Children will ask questions about the past – what was it like for people long ago? How has London changed and why? What caused The Great Fire of London?



Children will use artefacts, stories, online resources and information texts to find out about The Great Fire of London. They will build an understanding of what happened and why. Children will create an information poster about The Great Fire of London that they will present to others.
