Important Knowledge

Galleywood is a village and is part of Chelmsford.
 Chelmsford is a city in Essex, which is in the South East of England.
 Galleywood has lots of green areas and trail paths to walk around like through the commons.
 In Galleywood there are farms, vineyards and allotments.
 Galleywood is still a built-up estate with lots of different types of homes and it has shops, restaurants and a post office.
 The city of Chelmsford has a train station, links to an airport and a Cathedral
 Chelmsford is mostly flat and has a river, the river Chelmer running through it.
 Chelmsford and Galleywood would have looked very different a long time ago.

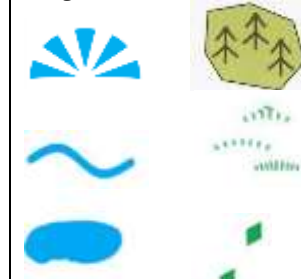
Vocabulary Dozen

- Galleywood**- A village surrounded by countryside which is part of Chelmsford.
- Chelmsford**-A city with a population of 168,000 people close to London in the county of Essex. Was granted city status in 2012.
- Essex**-A county on the South East of England between London and the North Sea.
- City**- A large town in the UK which has a Cathedral.
- Town**-A larger settlement which is the hub of market, trade and economy to surrounding areas. Usually larger and with more facilities than a village.
- Village**-A compact settlement of houses, usually based on agriculture and smaller than a town.
- Vineyard**-An area where grapes are farmed.
- Allotment**-Small plots of land for people to buy to grow crops.
- Common**- Land owned previously but now able to be used by everyone. Galleywood Common is made up of diverse habitats like scrub, grasslands and woods 44.6hectares large.
- River Chelmer**-A 65km river flowing only through Essex.
- Stansted airport**-An international airport located in Essex.
- London**-Capital City of England since Roman times. It is diverse, metropolitan and multi-cultural and is the hub for economy from the UK. The river Thames runs through it and its population is 8.92 million.
