Last Monday morning we were very pleased to welcome back to Galleywood Stacy the beekeeper from her farm in Bungay, in rural Norfolk. Stacy showed the children how she cares for her bees and shared lots of video clips to help them understand the essential role bees play in pollinating food crops. This week children in Foxes and Badgers classes have been writing sentences about honey and making honey sandwiches. They collected petals in our Forest area to try and make flavoured honey. In maths both classes are learning to count things that they cannot move, using different approaches and numbers up to 20.

In Year 2 children have been writing about pollination and finding out more about why we need to protect bees. They made honey flapjacks and also chopped and grated some fruit, adding yogurt and honey. It was delicious! In maths they have completed the unit on fractions, recognising a half, a third and a quarter. Now they are moving on to learn about time.

The children tasted 3 different kinds of honey and made yogurt with fruit and honey. They have been using their knowledge of plants to make observational drawings and also to weed and tidy our garden areas ready for some spring planting.
