



We are sad to say goodbye to Jen Hinkley, one of our team of midday assistants, and congratulate her on gaining a post as Learning Support Assistant in another school.


This week we have welcomed Miss Austin and Miss Smith to our midday team and hope they will both be very happy working with us.


Curriculum planning for 2024-25

There is a lot of information on our school website about the 6 learning themes planned for this year, starting with the question, "Where did you come from, pebble?" inspired by some wonderful texts, including:









We hope your child has been sharing their new learning with you, but we know that is not always the case!

Year 2 classes have been learning about Mary Anning and her life finding fossils on the Jurassic coast. They have focused on curiosity about the natural world. They are learning about fossils, how they are formed and what we can learn from studying them.

In art the children have looked at self-portraits by Pablo Picasso and Andy Warhol, learning a little about the artists and their lives as well as the different art techniques and designs that have made them famous.



In maths Yr2 children have been putting numbers onto an empty number line. They are learning to use their knowledge of number 0-10 to place numbers on a grid or line to 100. Children practise their number bonds to 10 on the White Rose maths appplease download this brilliant free app for your child to practise quick recall of maths facts. https://whiteroseeducation.com/1-minute-maths

Year 1 classes have enjoyed reading and writing linked to Harry and the Bucketful of Dinosaurs, and this week Harry and the Dinosaurs go to School. The children have loved remembering and sharing dinosaur facts about T-Rex, stegosaurus, triceratops and others.

In maths the children are comparing numbers using the symbols for greater than and less than. They have been rolling a dice, making a tower of cubes and using the symbols to compare this with their partner.

Learning in science has been about the changing seasons, looking for signs of autumn, going for walks around our school grounds and looking closely at different trees to compare leaves, fruit and seeds.

In music sessions with Ms Barnes, our music specialist teacher, the children used "boom whackers" to follow the C major scale and have been learning to read simple musical notation.

Foundation Stage classes have settled really well, enabling Mrs Foster and Mrs Keevil to complete the baseline assessments for everyone. Parents will have received a lot of updates and photos via Tapestry. Alongside lovely opportunities to play and learn in their classrooms and outdoors, the children are ready for some whole class learning now: they have had two weeks of phonics and daily maths sessions, two weeks of outdoor PE with their class teachers and also Forest Fun on Wednesdays. They have been learning about Sticky Starfish, one of our Galleywood Learning Stars, and also talking in classes about their own families and who is in their family.

Parents with a child due to start school in September 2025 will be able to make an application via www.Essex.gov.uk between 4th November 2024 and 15th January 2025. We offer three open mornings, this year on Tuesday 8th October, Wednesday 23rd October and Thursday 14th November, all from 9:30-11am.

Parents do not need to book for these sessions, but there are details on our website of six additional small group tours, which parents are able to book via the school office.

Contacting school

We know that for some parents it is not easy to get into school and speak with us and even when you are here, the drop off/ pick up times are very busy. We don't want parents or children to be worried about any aspect of school, so we welcome the chance to talk about any concerns or questions at an early stage.

If you request a phone call, staff members are usually able to call you at the end of the school day or sometimes during a lunch break if something is urgent.

There will usually be a member of staff in school by 7:30am and often staff are here until 6pm, although this varies a little from day to day. We endeavour to take phone calls and respond to queries promptly, but need to protect family time for all members of staff and ask you to understand that emails sent in the evening or over the weekend will usually receive a response the next working day.
